Introduction

Introduction

This survey is being conducted to identify awareness levels and attitudes of farmers to carbon storage and trading opportunities related to farm forestry. This survey will also help to identify ways farmers can better participate in the new carbon 'economy'.

This survey is part of a larger Carbon Plantations project managed by Private Forests Tasmania whose overall goal is to produce products and services for landholders so they can make better and more informed decisions about their participation in the emerging carbon economy.

The project is funded by the Australian Government through its Forest Industries Climate Change Research Fund.

What is involved in this Survey?

Rural Development Services is carrying out this phone survey with landholders in north east Tasmania.

Thirty landholders will be surveyed through phone interviews. Others will participate through web access. There will be four in-depth face to face interviews with key landholders.

The survey takes about 20 minutes to complete.
